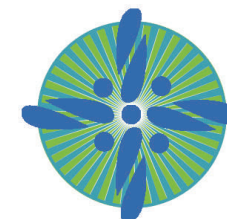

## Keynote Speaker

The Rev. Dr. Gordon W. Lathrop



Professor Lathrop is Charles A. Schieren Professor of Liturgy, Emeritus, at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia. Previously, he taught at Wartburg Theological Seminary, Dubuque, Iowa; was campus pastor at Pacific Lutheran University, Tacoma, Washington; and served as parish pastor in Darlington, Wisconsin. He has been a Lutheran pastor for 36 years, twenty of which were spent at the Seminary in Philadelphia. Among other books, he is the author of *Holy Things: A Liturgical Theology* (Fortress 1993), *Holy People: A Liturgical Ecclesiology* (Fortress, 1999), *Holy Ground: A Liturgical Cosmology* (Fortress, 2003), *Central Things: Worship in Word and Sacrament* (Augsburg Fortress, 2005), and *The Pastor: A Spirituality* (Fortress, 2006). Together with Timothy Wengert, he also published *Christian Assembly: Marks of the Church in a Pluralistic Age* (Fortress 2004). He has lectured widely, been a visiting professor at the Uppsala University in Sweden, and, in the 1990s, was a participant in Faith and Order consultations on worship and Christian unity, and Lutheran World Federation consultations on worship and culture. He is an associate editor of the journal *Worship* and was the tenth president of the North American Academy of Liturgy.

### *The Setting of Liturgy: Art and Architecture*

Mr. P. Michael O'Rourke and Mr. George Yu, Presenters

**George Yu**, founder of GYA Architects in 1980, has designed over seventy educational and religious projects. The restoration/renovation of both the St. Thomas of Villanova Chapel at Villanova University and The Philadelphia Cathedral are among his completed religious projects. He taught at the University of Pennsylvania and served as guest lecturer at universities and seminaries throughout the USA and Japan.

**P. Michael O'Rourke AIA** has 28 years of experience in church and religious school planning and design for a variety of Christian denominations. A senior associate at KCBA Architects, Mr. O'Rourke has designed over 25 new and renovated church projects as well as many religious education centers and has won numerous awards. He is a board member of the Philadelphia Liturgical Institute.

### *The Service of Liturgy: Presiding*

Rev. Gerald Dennis Gill, Rev. Dr. Kevin Moroney, Presenters

**Rev. Gerald Dennis Gill**, Director of the Office for Worship, for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, completed graduate studies in Sacred Liturgy at Catholic University of America and the Pontifical Liturgical Institute of Saint Anselmo in Rome. Father Gill served a five-year term as Director of Liturgy at the Pontifical North American College in Vatican City State. He continues as a professor of Sacred Liturgy at Immaculata University and St. Charles Borromeo Seminary, and as a frequent speaker on the Sacred Liturgy throughout the country.

**The Rev. Dr. Kevin Moroney** is an Episcopal priest serving as Rector of Christ Church in Villanova, PA. He is also an adjunct professor at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia, teaching Liturgy and Greek. He holds a Ph.D. in Liturgy from the Milltown Institute, Dublin, Ireland and is the former lecturer in liturgy at the Church of Ireland Theological College.

### *The Sounds of Liturgy: Music*

Prof. Roger Allen, Sr. Marganne Drago, SSJ, Rev. Dr. F. Russell Mitman, Rev. Dr. Norman A. Hjelm, Presenters

**Professor Roger Allen** was trained in organ in Bristol and Oxford, England. He was organist-choirmaster at St. Mary's Church, Hamilton Village, Philadelphia, between 1974 and 2000. He currently attends the Church of St. Asaph in Bala Cynwyd, and is Professor of Arabic and Comparative Literature and Chair of the Department of Near Eastern Languages and Civilizations at the University of Pennsylvania.

**Sr. Marganne Drago**, a Sister of St. Joseph, Chestnut Hill, holds a doctorate in Music and masters degrees in Music Education and Liturgy. Sister is presently director of Sacred Music and Liturgy at Stella Maris Church in South Philadelphia, where she serves as organist and choir director.

**The Rev. Russell Mitman** served for 24 years as pastor of three congregations of the United Church of Christ, has authored four books on worship leadership and has consulted with churches and pastors in the ecumenical community toward the revitalization of their worship life. He is presently Conference Minister and President of Pennsylvania Southeast Conference, United Church of Christ.

**The Rev. Dr. Norman A. Hjelm**, former Director and Senior Editor of Fortress Press, Philadelphia, also served on the senior executive staff of the Lutheran World Federation, Geneva, Switzerland and, from 1991-96, was Director of the Commission on Faith and Order of the National Council of the Churches of Christ in the U.S. In 2009 he received an honorary doctorate in theology from Uppsala University in Sweden.
